<u>Building Committee</u> has scheduled meetings once a week each Thursday starting at 10:00am. The meetings are open to the membership. A Building Committee report will be presented at the April meeting.

The Benefit Committee. The IATSENBF has updated their website to allow participants to audit their Health and Pension Accounts on a more timely basis. This is your money. Check your accounts often and inform the Office if they are incorrect. To access your personal account, go to iatsenbf.org. On the left hand side is a log-in option. Follow the prompts and get your log-in username and password. Once on your personal page, on the left hand side is a work history option. The Office has been contacted by members and has followed up on missing benefits. Help us help you by checking your accounts. If money is missing, give the Office the Employer and month the contribution is missing. The benefit committee will also be bringing in members 65 and older to review the Pension application process. If you are 65 or older and would like to set up an appointment, the Committee meets the last Wednesday of each month at the union hall 11:00a.m.

The Education Committee Local 8 was informed the state funding we have been receiving will be being cut this year due to a change of leadership in the House Speaker position. As reported, house speaker Perzel was instrumental in getting Local 8 educational money. Through the new leadership, Local 8 was given a 2.5 million dollar educational grant this year which we are using to construct an education and training facility. Until the funding is re-established, the Local will be going back to its grass roots training program. We will be asking employers to allow us to use their facilities (free of charge) and to pick up cost associated with training. We will also be asking our own members to volunteer to give courses. Training will focus on the apprentice program, maintaining the "Core Classes", ETCP Certification training in Rigging and Electric and advanced training targeted at specialized equipment used by our members. The Committee has met numerous times and has formulated a program to address these areas
